



Liaison Report: Spring 2024 Status of the Organization

National Register/American Psychological Foundation Internship Travel Scholarship

The 2023 Internship Travel Scholarship cycle was another major success. Following a comprehensive review of the candidates, we presented 80 incoming interns with \$1,000 scholarships to help ease the financial burden associated with re-location to their selected internship site. We are proud of what we have accomplished to date, but we are also aware that this program impacted a fraction of the estimated 2,300 graduate students who will need to move for internship each year. Our fervent wish is to attract sufficient donations to fund more scholarships on a recurring basis, but to do that we will need to raise at least \$100,000 a year. Psychology Connect

The National Register recently launched *Psychology Connect*, a referral tool that aims to address the extreme shortage of mental health resources. Psychology Connect is a free referral database that connects health service psychologists across the country who are looking to refer a patient. We have incorporated PSYPACT so we can accommodate interstate practice. Feedback from users has shown this to be a much more effective method of seeking patient services than the traditional reliance on state associations or listservs, as we have a nationwide audience. Credentialing scholarships cover application fees so that early career psychologists can bank their training and licensure credentials. Once credentials are primary source verified and the Health Service Psychologist credential is granted, the psychologist gains immediate access to benefits including expedited licensure mobility in the U.S. and Canada, credentials verification to healthcare organizations, hospitals, and employers, consumer referrals via FindaPsychologist.org, live and on-demand continuing education, and more.
